Martin onto the Parish Council</p> <p><b>Speed Limit Ingleby Greenhow</b>  A Resident asked could the speed limit through Ingleby Greenhow not be reduce to 20mph. Cllr T. Sutcliffe informed the meeting that in the past the Parish Council has made inquired about having the speed limited lowered. Ingleby Greenhow School also in the past have asked for 20mph in school hours. A number of years ago speed strips were painted onto the road, this was to slow traffic down coming into the village. Also in the past a speed counter was taken put it was felt that this was done at the wrong time of day.  NYCC Cllr H Moorhouse suggested the Parish Council should contact Traffic Bureau York asking if they would do a speed check in Ingleby Greenhow. There is also concern from residents on Marsh Lane about the traffic speeding along this road.  Parish Clerk to inquired cost of repeater 30mph signs for Marsh Lane.  The Parish Council felt the Parish seems to be a route for cycles events.</p>

The Woodland Trust had send out contractor to take some of the trees down. It was felt that this has not made any difference to the Highway issues. Unfortunately the Parish Council and the Local Warden were not informed when the work would be done. The Parish Council felt that the Woodland Trust should put in place a programme to manage the wood, and that some areas need to be thinned out. There is a log over the beck which will possibly cause flooding. It was agreed to have a site meeting with the Local Woodland Trust Office to discuss issues, and the village hall Committee regarding their area. Also there were issues with trees on the side of the road which the houses are on.</p>
