6.6	<p>NYM/2019/0716/AGR/AGRP ATKINSON WOOD FARM EASBY Erection of agricultural storage building The Parish Council has no objections. Their only concern is to the existing mature tree which is near to where the new building is going to be and also the obstruction to the public footpath to be considered</p>
6.7	<p>LOCAL PLAN NYMNPA This is still at the public inquire stage. The Parish Council did comment on this plan. When agreed no building work outside the plan area are to be agreed by the NYMNPA.</p>
7 7.1	<p>TO RECEIVE AND CONSIDER PLANNING APPLICATIONS RECEIVED FROM HDC. 19/02148/FUL DRUMMER HILL FARM EASBY Change of use to allow the housing of livestock within the existing building (when required) which has previously been approved to use as machinery and grain store and was approved under prior notification reference 15/00861/APN. Livestock use to be generally over winter period. The Parish Council resolved to object to the application. The Parish Council felt that there were an environmental health issues likely to be harmful and disruptive to the occupiers due to the smell and noise as the building is in close proximity to the farm house. Also concerns as to slurry disposed arrangement..</p>

9	<p>DEFIBRILLATOR</p> <p>The Chairman has contacted HDC for an update as to when they will be installed. The Officer is still looking for a bracket for the defibrillators to be attach to the poles</p>
10	<p>HIGHWAY ISSUES ON GOING</p>
10.1	<p>Baysdale Farm House</p> <p>Planned road closure 23148 Kildale to Baysdale 4th November to 8th November. The work had not stated on the 12th November. A Highway Engineer has been out to look at the work which need to be done and he felt that the work plan was incorrect. Cllr H Moorhouse agreed to look into this matter.</p>
10.2	<p>Slow sign on road near entrance to Baysdale off the Kildale Road</p> <p>Now completed</p>
10.3	<p>High House Farm, Greenhow Bottom</p> <p>Planned road closure 23149 How Hill to Greenhow Botton 11th November to 15th November. No work had started on the 12th November.</p>
10.4	<p>Old Battersby to to Junction of Marsh Lane/Lamb Lane Ingleby Greenhow C24 Road conditions.</p> <p>Response from Area 2 Highway. The section of Stone Stoup Road from Church bank towards Battersby as been marked up for design purposes only as patching works on this length of road are included in the 2020/21 capital programme with a view to surface dressing in 2020/21.</p> <p>Highways noted the Parish Council comments about the volume of patches marked and confirm that the Engineers have assessed the road and marked and identified the most cost effective solution for this road which includes sections of resurfacing structural patching and overlays. Highways confirmed that currently there is no capital funding allocated for the section of road from Church Bank to Lambs Lane. As with all roads it will continue to be inspected in line with the Highway Safety Inspection Manual until such time that capital funds become available for more extensive works. With regard to School Bank, this road has been fully resurfaced and does not require a surface dressing treatment at the present time.</p> <p>The Parish Council felt disappointed that the all of the road could not be repaired at the same time and will continue to work to have the roads that have missed out on improvement be tackled as a priority.</p>
10.5	<p>Blocked Gullies Ingleby Greenhow.</p> <p>A request for the road and footpath sweeper to come out and remove the leaves of the footpath which were considered danger on Church Bank and also the gully cleaner for Old Battersby</p>

10.6	Traffic Bureau. Residents on Marsh Lane are concerned about the speed of the Traffic. A resident took the form away to ask other residents on Marsh Lane about requesting a speed concern report.
