10	NYC COUNCILLOR REPORT Unclassified Roads in Ingleby Greenhow Parish Coleson Bank and Turney Nap to Bloworth Crossing. The Parish Council are concerned about the amount of money that has been spent on these two unclassified roads in the Parish. NYC H Moorhouse informed the meeting that the NYMNP help manage these roads. The Parish Council felt that while these roads are being upgraded it invites more four-by-four to use them and causes problems for residents. The Parish Council RESOLVED to contact Ian Kelly at NYC under the Freedom of Information Act,

	asking for details on the amount of money which has been spend on these two roads in the last 10 years.
11	<p>PARISH COUNCILLOR'S REPORT</p> <p>1. Yellow Lines at School Cllr T Sutcliffe reported that when the yellow lines were redone the contractor left a larger round circle of yellow paint on the parking area of the school and a line of yellow paint on the road. To be reported to Highway.</p> <p>2. Local History Group Cllr T Sutcliffe reported that the history group are looking at doing a plaque on the history of the Parish.</p> <p>3. Country Bridge Marsh Lane, Ingleby Greenhow Heritage & Conservation Officer from NYMNPA, confirm by email to Cllr T Sutcliffe that they do not believe the fencing is part of the original Ingleby Bridge and was added some time after, with it being physically attached to the bridge it would need Listed Building Consent for its removal. The Officer has contacted Highway on this matter and is waiting for the LBC application to come in. Cllr T Sutcliffe proposed that the Parish Council write to both Highways and the NYMNPA confirming that the Parish Council wished to see the LB Bridge fencing and sandstone post restored. It was RESOLVED to write to both NYC Highways and NYMNPA requesting that the bridge fencing and sandstone post be restored. The local history group are looking into the details of the bridge.</p> <p>4. Grants 137 Parish Clerk to check how much the Parish Council can allocate on the grants under section137</p> <p>5. Streetlight at corner near Maples Lodge Old Battersby Parish Clerk was to seek to see if it is to stay on all night</p> <p>6. Park Wall on Turkey Nab Cllr T Sutcliffe reported that an Archaeological consultant Was undergoing a study of the boundary wall at Park Wood The Forestry England are looking at restoring this wall</p> <p>7. The Railway Siding Housing Broadacres Housing Association Ltd The houses and two flats have section106 relating to local occupancy. One of the flats had come vacant, the Parish Council had been informed after it had been let that it had been advertised on six separate occasions when no one had applied With the local connection it had then been advertised on the NYMNPA site, the Parish Council felt that they should have been informed of this by Broadacres as the details of the flat could have been advertised locally.</p>
