

**INGLEBY GREENHOW PARISH COUNCIL MEETING**

<b>1</b>	<b>ELECTION OF OFFICERS</b>
<b>1.1</b>	<b>Chairman</b> Cllr T. Sutcliffe proposed by Cllr L. Smith,, seconded by Cllr T. Hill. All agreed
<b>1.2</b>	<b>Vice Chairman</b> Cllr T. Hill proposed by Cllr L. Smith Seconded by Cllr T. Sutcliffe, all agreed.
<b>1.3</b>	<b>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</b> HDC Cllr R. Kirk The chairman welcomed to the meeting NYCC Cllr H. Moorhouse, HDC Cllr R. Hudson, B. Beveridge from Battersby Junction, F & J. Porter from Ingleby Greenhow
<b>2</b>	<b>OPEN FORUM</b>
<b>2.1</b>	<b>Letter received from Mr A. Fawcett.</b> <b>Verge Cutting</b> Mr A. Fawcett enquired about the grass cutting of the road sides. The Parish Council has now instructed the parish caretaker to do the first cut which would be half a wide cut as per agreed schedule of verge maintenance.
<b>2.2</b>	<b>Woodland Trust</b> Evergreens and an Ash tree growing onto the road near Ingleby Greenhow and Easby Village hall. It was agreed to contact the Woodland Trust about these issue.
<b>2.3</b>	<b>Gt Broughton Parish</b> Two other issues were in Gt Broughton Parish and would be reported to them. Coates planting on both side of the road hedges growing onto the road. Also from Pond House to Chapel Garth over growing hedges, and at Well Farm. Near the seat at Well Farm there are two dangerous pot holes
<b>3</b>	<b>POLICE REPORT</b> No report received in time for meeting. A quad bike had been stolen from a farm in Ingleby Greenhow

<b>5.1</b>	<b>HDC</b> None have been received
<b>6</b>	<b>PLANNING APPLICATION GRANTED BY NYMNPA AND H.D.C</b> None received
<b>7</b>	<b>VACANCY IN OFFICE OF COUNCILLOR</b> HDC have received insufficient request from eligible electors for an election to fill the vacancy. The Parish Council have now received interested. The Parish Council will consider opting a person onto the council at the next meeting if interest is confirmed

<b>8</b>	<b>HIGHWAYS ISSUES.</b>
<b>8.1</b>	<b>Resurfacing of Footpaths Ingleby Greenhow</b> The section near Avenida, and Eleanors View has been improved. Cllr T. Sutcliffe would contact NYCC and stated on a good job has been made on the footpaths so far.
<b>8.2</b>	<b>Sunnyside to the school</b> This remain to narrow to walk on because of the hedge alongside the footpath and children walking to school have to cross over the road, which becomes a safety issue. It was agreed by Cllr T. Hill to contact Ingleby Greenhow School Governor's about this section of footpath to see want their views were and to be kept on the Parish Council long term plan.
<b>8.3</b>	<b>Drop Kerbs</b> A request had been made for some drop kerbs in Ingleby Greenhow. With regard to the dropped kerb down Church bank it was felt that this is not in a correct place should have been at the top of the bank. The issue of good access for disabled, wheelchairs, and pushchairs is to remain a Parish Council goal.
<b>8.4</b>	<b>School Bank</b> This has now been resurfaced
<b>8.5</b>	<b>Lamb Lane to Ingleby Bank</b> This was to be resurfaced in 2018/19 work programme. There had been some pots holes repair work completed and this was not in a very good order. It was agreed to complaints to NYCC about the workmanship and that many potholes remain
<b>8.6</b>	<b>Footpath Ingleby Greenhow</b> The NYMNPA Rangers has been out and stones the path toward the Manor. The Parish Councillor's to look at the path.
<b>9.</b>	<b>VERGE CUTTING</b>
<b>9.1</b>	It was agreed the programme would be 1 <sup>st</sup> cut June, 2 <sup>nd</sup> cut August and 3 <sup>rd</sup> cut back to hedge in September and review as necessary.
<b>9.2</b>	Someone has cut the verges near Lamb Lane entrance before the Parish Council's cut.
<b>9.3</b>	NYCC has send a purchase order payment for the Parish Council cutting some of the verges on Junction visibility splays.
<b>10</b>	<b>COUNCILORS REPORT</b>
<b>10.1</b>	<b>Superfast Broadband</b> It was noted that his was not up and running yet. Cllr H Moorhouse to check date for becoming operational with nynet.
<b>10.2</b>	<b>Atkinson Wood Farm</b> It was agreed to contact NYMAPA for an update on the work which has been done on the listed building without any consent.
<b>10.3</b>	<b>Fly Tipping</b> HDC Cllr R. Hudson asked about the grass waste which was at the top of Church Lane on the unsuitable road. He was informed that this has been report a number of time. HDC say they are unable to collect from this area.. Cllr R. Hudson agreed to look into this.
<b>11</b>	<b>BJCA</b>
<b>11.1</b>	B. Beveridge had written on behalf of Battersby Junction Community Association, asking if the Parish Council would be able to claim the vat back on the purchase of the play equipments for the Association.. This cannot be done.
<b>11.2</b>	It was agreed to give £500 net toward the turf and grass seeds, for the first year, Would look at supporting the project next year maybe on insurance, would need

	to see the inspection report first. Cllr T. Sutcliffe informed B. Beveridge that he felt the Association had work well to get to this stage.
