Moorhouse reported – New Countrywide contracts were going to be issued, on supplying broadband to new areas. The Parish Council agreed that they would write and make a case for extending Broadband to Battersby Junction and Old Battersby to NYNET once details are known.</p> <p>Atkinson Wood Farm The previous email received from the NYMNPA on the unauthorised external alterations to the listed building was discussed. The Parish Clerk had asked for a copy of the draft schedule of work which has been sent to the tenant. NYMNPA has informed the Parish Council that the schedule is not for the public domain at the present time. The Parish Council have not received any information to what has happened to the pigsties and privies which are grade 2 Listed. A letter would be sent to A. Muir at the NYMNPA asking for an update to see where they are now with this unauthorised building and demolition activity.. NYCC Cllr H. Moorhouse agreed to ask for an update.</p>

The Parish Council felt the outline plan they had received was not the same as what has been build on the site. 	<p>This can be seen at www.northyorkmoors.org.uk/currentthinking Any responses from the public or landowners or Councillors to be email to policy@northyorkmoors.org.uk Ingleby Greenhow PC discussed the NYMNPA Local Plan consultation, along with the response to the consultation. In General terms the PC supports the approach of the “Current Thinking document.” In particular, the PC wished to see any housing development targeted at meeting local need and of a scale suitable for integration into settlements of Ingleby Greenhow and Battersby Junction. With regard to the Undeveloped and Community Spaces plans for Ingleby Greenhow: There is agreement that areas IUS-01, 03, and 04 Undeveloped spaces are supported. However, the PC question the justification for the inclusion of area 02, as this is not seen as an important viewpoint within the village and could potentially be considered as a possible infill site. Similarly area 05 is elevated above the road a there is no view out to open landscape beyond it, only to a gable of a modern brick property, however there is a view into a green space when entering the village from Stone Stoup (East) which could justify a narrower frontage strip being protected. With regard area 05 the PC considered that this area is outside of the village and should be categorised as open countryside, rather than being identified as an undeveloped space. As well as the churchyard the PC request that the school playing field is added to the identified community space. The playing field has the benefit of a public right of way passing through it and has always been open access and used for informal play by local youngsters. Battersby Junction The PC consider that the railway station car park and picnic site should be identified as a community space,</p>
