

**INGLEBY GREENHOW PARISH COUNCIL MEETING**  
**Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2018**  
**to be held in Ingleby Greenhow & Easby village hall at 7.30pm**

<b>1</b>	<p><b>PRESENT</b>  Cllr T. Sutcliffe Chairman, Cllr T. Hill Vice Chairman, Cllr L. Smith, Cllr F. Porter, Cllr M. Staples, M B Bowes Parish Clerk, NYCC Cllr H. Moorhouse</p> <p><b>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</b>  HDC Cllr R. Kirk and Cllr R. Hudson, Cllr T. Sutcliffe had informed the Clerk that he would late attending the meeting. It was agreed for Cllr T. Hill take the chair.</p>
<b>2</b> <b>2.1</b>	<p><b>OPEN FORUM</b>  <b>Battersby Junction Access Road</b>  M B Bowes a resident of Battersby Junction informed the Parish Council that section of road leading into the junction is subsiding. The location is at the top of the bank above and either side of the culvert. The length of the section is across the road and made ground that creates a level surface for the road.  A geotechnical engineer has had a look at the issue. The initial inspection indicates that the cause is slippage of a C shaped slab of the steep bank, rather than the culvert collapsing, although it could be a just below the surface. The culvert itself appears to be stable but needs checking. The brickwork on the bank face above the culvert has moved outwards which backs up the theory that a slab of the bank is slipping. Its impossible to tell how long the bank will last. It could be weeks, months, or even a few years. The bank needs stabilising. Two possibilities were proposed – soil nailing into the side of the slope (at the top of the bank and just above the culvert) or gabion baskets. A company which worked on a collapsed road at Liverton (using soil nailing) came to look. They propose a ground survey to a depth of 5 to 6 metres, using 6 to 8 boreholes. Tarmac will be reinstated. A report will provide the information that a soil nailing contractor would need to design and cost a solution. The survey will cost £2000+VAT. A meeting going to be held with the residents of Battersby Junction to decide the way forward at the village hall.</p>
<b>2.2</b>	<p><b>COLESON BANK</b>  The NYCC closure is on until September 2018. Cllr L. Smith had received a draft assessment on the road. It was agreed that the Parish Council need to start on a proposal to have the road closed on a permanent basis.</p>

Change of use of agricultural building to dwelling house The Parish Council had received complaints about the four white gable ends of the building. The complaints had been forward on to the Enforcement Officer at Hambleton District Council. Mr Harrison was to be requested by HDC to remove the gable ends or submit an application for the roof/first additions to the building the deadline was the 15<sup>th</sup> January.</p> <p><b>Ingleby Estate Water at Old Battersby</b> Cllr L. Smith gave an update, A planning application for the housing of the filter has been submitted. The residents would like to thank the Council for dealing with this prior to the meeting to try and speed the process up as much as possible. The villagers have agreed, reluctantly to contribute to the purchase and installation of the system and will be in discussion with the Estate when further details of the proposed system are available to them. They have currently been without drinking water for 22 weeks and it could be March before their supply is restored. The Parish Council agreed to support the residents.</p> <p><b>Old Battersby 30mph</b> The Parish Council had received a request from a resident at Old Battersby asking could the 30mph signs not been moved further out of the village near the village sign. The Parish Council had requested this in 2015 and was turned down by NYCC. Cllr H. Moorhouse had contacted Tony Lewis at Highways who had informed her that the situation has not changed.</p> <p><b>Atkinson Wood Farm</b> The Parish Council had not received any more information on the work which has been undertaken on the buildings. Cllr H. Moorhouse informed the meeting that no plans had been submitted to the NYMNPA. It had been noted that work has been undertaken on the trees in the avenue, Parish Clerk to contact NYMNPA about this.</p> <p><b>Broadband Ingleby Greenhow</b> This is now up and running in Ingleby Greenhow, residents do have to sign up to go onto the new system. Cllr H. Moorhouse informed the meeting that residents at Battersby Junction and Old Battersby need to go online and sign up requesting broadband in the villages.</p> <p><b>Marsh lane Ingleby Greenhow</b> Unit 11 light the old column has still not been moved.</p> <p><b>NYMNP Local Plan Undeveloped and Community Spaces</b> No response has been received from the NYMNPA to the consultation.</p>
